EVERGREENS

White Pine (*Pinus strobus*)

Fast growing pine. Loosely pyramidal as a young tree becomes more irregular with age. Mature height 100'. Rapid growth rate.

Bare Root Size: 18-24" \$6.50 per bundle

Blue Spruce (*Picea pungens*)

Best known of the spruce family. Noted for its hardiness and attractive blue color. Mature height 30-60'. Slow growth rate.

Bare Root Size: 18-24" \$7.60 per bundle

Norway Spruce (*Picea abies*)

Fastest growing of the spruces. Develops strong graceful branches that are covered with dark green needles. Ideal for windbreaks. Mature height 80'. Slow growth rate.

Bare Root Size: 18-24" \$7.60 per bundle

Douglas Fir (*Pseudotsuga menziesii*)

A noble pyramid tree with excellent landscape value and an incredibly popular Christmas tree with its short needles that do not easily fall. Mature height 50-60'. Moderate growth rate.

Bare Root Size: 12-18" \$7.25 per bundle

White Cedar (*Thuja occidentalis*)

A broad pyramidal tree with a lush dark green summer color. Great for wind breaks. Mature height 40-60'. Slow growth rate.

Bare Root Size: 20-32" \$6.75 per bundle

DECIDUOUS

Swamp White Oak (*Quercus bicolor*)

Exhibits many of the qualities of the White Oak. Does well in moist to wet soils. Is drought resistant. Has a yellow to purple fall color. Mature height 50-60'. Rapid growth rate.

Bare Root Size: 24-36" \$7.60 per bundle

River Birch (*Betula nigra*)

Tolerant to many soil conditions. Reddish brown exfoliating bark. Resistant to bronze birch borer. Mature height 40-70'. Rapid growth rate.

Bare Root Size: 24-36" \$7.60 per bundle

Sycamore (*Platanus occidentalis*)

A native fast growing tree with grayish bark that exfoliates to expose the inner creamy white bark. Mature height 75-100'. Rapid growth rate.

Bare Root Size: 24-38" \$7.60 per bundle

Tulip Poplar (*Liriodendron tulipifera*)

Is a fast growing tree with distinctive greenish yellow flowers in the spring. Mature height 70-90'. Rapid growth rate.

Bare Root Size: 24-36" \$7.60 per bundle

Bur Oak (*Quercus macrocarpa*)

Does well in a variety of soil conditions. Noted for its corky branches. Leaf color is dark green in summer and yellow to yellowish brown in fall. Mature height 70-80'. Fairly slow growth rate.

Bare Root Size: 24-36" \$7.60 per bundle

Northern Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*)

Large fast growing trees with reddish fall color. Tree is broad and rounded. Excellent for wildlife planting. Mature height 60-75'. Rapid growth rate.

Bare Root Size: 24-36" \$8.50 per bundle

Button Bush (*Cephalanthus Occidentalis*)

A small bush that bears attractive summer foliage with creamy-white flowers appearing in late summer. Mature height 5-10". Slow growth rate.

Bare Root Size: 24-36" \$7.60 per bundle

Gray Dogwood (*Cornus racemosa*)

Tall dense growing shrub that produces white flowers in late spring and white berries in late fall to early winter.. Mature height 10-15 ft. Slow growth rate.

Sargent Crabapple (*Malus sargentii*)

A dwarf broad growing tree with fragrant white flowers that are followed by small bright red fruit (enjoyed by birds). Green summer foliage. Mature height 6-10'. Slow growth rate.

Highbush Cranberry (*Viburnum trilobum*)

Yellow to red purple fall color. New foliage has a reddish color. Bears extremely handsome whiter flowers and bright red fruit. Mature height 8-12 ft. Slow growth rate.

FRUIT TREES

All trees are 1/2" to 5/8" diameter, bareroot stock. Trees are priced at **\$25.00 each**.

Apple—should have 2 different apple species to allow for cross pollination.

- **Liberty**—Disease resistant, red over green apple, ripens in September and a heavy annual crop. Semi-dwarf.
- **Red Jonaprince**—Exceptional eating quality, large fruit size and high yield potential. Dwarf
- **Honeycrisp**—#1 in taste tests, red apple, good keeper, very winter hardy, ripens end of September. Semi-dwarf.
- **Golden Delicious**—Fruit is firm, medium to large with classic Golden Delicious flavor. Semi-dwarf.
- **Wolf River**—Early season apple, excellent for cooking and baking. Semi-dwarf.
- **Yellow Transparent**—Early yellow apple ripening in the first week of July. Semi-dwarf.
- **Snowsweet**—It has a crisp texture and sweet flavor. Dwarf.
- **Chrisolyn Jonathan**—Flavor and texture are tart and crisp and the fruit has held up well in storage tests. Semi-dwarf.
- **Rogers Red McIntosh**—Good storage qualities and winter hardiness. Semi-dwarf.

Peach

- **Contender**—Very large, firm, with excellent color. Semi-dwarf.
- **Redhaven**—Bud hardy, large peach and excellent flavor. Semi-dwarf.
- **Veteran**—Excellent quality for both fresh eating and canning. Semi-dwarf.
- **Madison**—Recommended for northern climates, medium to large size. Semi-dwarf.

Pear—should have 2 different pear species to allow for cross pollination.

- **Blake's Pride**—Disease resistant, a yellow pear with good texture, ripens mid August. Semi-dwarf.
- **Magness**—Flesh is soft, juicy and almost free of grit cells. Semi-dwarf.
- **Potomac**—The tree is moderately vigorous and resistant to fire blight. Semi-dwarf.

Cherry

- **Black Gold**—Self-pollinating, large sweet fruit, winter hardy. Semi-dwarf.
- **Montmorency**—Tart cherry, trees are self-fertile, winter hardy. Semi-dwarf.
- **Kristin Cherry**—Trees are very winter hardy and productive. Semi-dwarf.

Plum

- **Shiro**—Sweet, juicy, yellow plum medium in size. Semi-dwarf.
- **Methley**—Early plum with fine quality and appearance. Semi-dwarf.

NATIVE PLANTS - \$2.50 EACH

<p style="text-align: center;">Yellow Coneflower (<i>Ratibida pinnata</i>)</p> <p>Bright yellow rays surround a gray cone-shaped center. Grows 3 to 4 feet tall and is best planted among other tall perennials. Prefers full sun. Excellent for wildflower meadows.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Plug \$2.50 EACH</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Downy Sunflower (<i>Helianthus mollis</i>)</p> <p>Beautiful 3 inch blossoms appear over downy gray green foliage. Native to sandy or loamy prairies, it prefers loose well-drained soil. Grows 2 to 4 feet in full sun. Excellent for attracting songbirds.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Plug \$2.50 EACH</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Butterflyweed (<i>Asclepias tuberosa</i>)</p> <p>As its name indicates, this resident of well-drained prairies is very attractive to butterflies. Clusters of vivid orange flowers appear from June through August. Requires excellent drainage and full sun. Breaks dormancy late. Grows 1-2 feet tall.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Plug \$2.50 EACH</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Wild Geranium (<i>Geranium maculatum</i>)</p> <p>This attractive woodland wildflower produces showy pink blossoms in late April and May. Grows around a foot in height in partial to full shade and well-drained soil. An excellent addition to the woodland garden or restoration.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Plug \$2.50 EACH</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Dense Blazing Star (<i>Liatris Spicata</i>)</p> <p>Tall spikes of purple flowers appear in July and August. Native to moist prairies and sedge meadows, it thrives in full sun and ordinary garden soil. Excellent for attracting birds and butterflies. Outstanding bouquets. Grows 3-5 feet.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Plug \$2.50 EACH</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Cardinal Flower (<i>Lobelia cardinalis</i>)</p> <p>Brilliant red flowers along tall spikes appear in August and September. Excellent for attracting hummingbirds. Grows 2 to 5 feet in moist to wet soils in sun or partial shade.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Plug \$2.50 EACH</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Big Bluestem (<i>Andropogon gerardii</i>)</p> <p>The classic grass of the tall grass prairie, reaching a height of 5-8' in any soil and full sun. The branched seed heads, resembling a turkey's foot, appear in July and August. The lush foliage turns a rich reddish brown in fall, slowly fading through the winter.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Plug \$2.50 EACH</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Indian Grass (<i>Sorghastrum nutans</i>)</p> <p>A beautiful tallgrass with feathery golden seed heads that appear in August and September. Plant in full sun and any soil. Excellent with tall wildflowers, this bold plant turns shades of orange and yellow in the fall.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Plug \$2.50 EACH</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Prairie Dropseed (<i>Sporobolus heterolepis</i>)</p> <p>This beautiful fine-textured prairie grass forms a graceful fountain of bright green foliage. Delicately scented, seedheads appear in mid to late summer. The foliage turns shades of red, yellow and orange in the fall. This ornamental grass develops slowly, but is worth the wait. Full sun in well-drained soil for best results. Grows 1-3 feet.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Plug \$2.50 EACH</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Little Bluestem (<i>Schizachyrium scoparium</i>)</p> <p>A medium stature grass with exceptional ornamental qualities. Attractive bluish-green foliage grows about 12 inches high by mid-summer. Fluffy seed appears along the 2 to 3 foot seed stalks that emerge in August. The foliage turns beautiful shades of reddish brown in autumn, remaining attractive through the winter.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Plug \$2.50 EACH</p>



TREE GUARDS

The tree guards are \$3 each and include stakes and ties. They work best on deciduous tree seedlings. The tree tube helps seedlings get established when deer or other pests are a problem. Instructions on installation included with each tube kit.



RAIN BARRELS
