



## NATIVE PLANTS - SOLD INDIVIDUALLY

<p><b>Purple Coneflower</b> (<i>Echinacea purpurea</i>)</p> <p>Large pink flowers with spiny orange centers appear in July and August. The hardy drought-resistant plants grow 3 to 4 feet tall. Thrives in full sun or partial shade. The flowers are excellent for cutting and attract butterflies.</p> <p>Plug \$2.40 EACH</p>	<p><b>New England Aster</b> (<i>Aster novae-angliae</i>)</p> <p>This resident of mesic prairies and sedge meadows produces masses of showy purple flowers in September and early October. Prefers full sun and moist soil. Cut back in early summer to produce a bushier plant. Attracts butterflies.</p> <p>Plug \$2.40 EACH</p>
<p><b>Plains Coreopsis</b> (<i>Coreopsis palmata</i>)</p> <p>A low stature prairie plant producing bright golden flowers on 1 to 2 foot plants. Spreads to form pleasing clumps. Plant in well drained soil and full sun. Blooms July-August.</p> <p>Plug \$2.40 EACH</p>	<p><b>Spotted Joe Pye Weed</b> (<i>Eupatorium maculatum</i>)</p> <p>A handsome plant with deep pink, flat topped flower clusters in August and September. An excellent plant for difficult wet areas, it is sure to attract butterflies. Grows 4 to 6 feet tall in full sun.</p> <p>Plug \$2.40 EACH</p>
<p><b>Heath Aster</b> (<i>Aster ericoides</i>)</p> <p>This compact aster covers itself with small white flowers in September. Grows 1 to 2 feet in full sun and any well drained soil.</p> <p>Plug \$2.40 EACH</p>	<p><b>Cardinal Flower</b> (<i>Lobelia cardinalis</i>)</p> <p>Brilliant red flowers along tall spikes appear in August and September. Excellent for attracting hummingbirds. Grows 2 to 5 feet in moist to wet soils in sun or partial shade.</p> <p>Plug \$2.40 EACH</p>
<p><b>Palm Sedge</b> (<i>Carex muskingumensis</i>)</p> <p>An attractive sedge of wet woods, it has lush shy dark green foliage throughout the growing season. Pointed seedheads appear in early summer. Makes an attractive groundcover in moist shady areas when planted on 10 inch centers.</p> <p>Plug \$2.40 EACH</p>	<p><b>Butterfly Weed</b> (<i>Asclepias tuberosa</i>)</p> <p>As its name indicates, this resident of well-drained prairies is very attractive to butterflies. Clusters of vivid orange flowers appear from June through August. Requires excellent drainage and full sun. Breaks dormancy late. Grows 1-2 feet tall.</p> <p>Plug \$2.40 EACH</p>
<p><b>Indian Grass</b> (<i>Sorghastrum nutans</i>)</p> <p>A beautiful tallgrass with feathery golden seed heads that appear in August and September. Plant in full sun and any soil. Excellent with tall wildflowers, this bold plant turns shades of orange and yellow in the fall.</p> <p>Plug \$2.40 EACH</p>	<p><b>Little Bluestem</b> (<i>Schizachyrium scoparium</i>)</p> <p>A medium stature grass with exceptional ornamental qualities. Attractive bluish-green foliage grows about 12 inches high by mid-summer. Fluffy seed appears along the 2 to 3 foot seed stalks that emerge in August. The foliage turns beautiful shades of reddish brown in autumn, remaining attractive through the winter.</p> <p>Plug \$2.40 EACH</p>

- ◆ Native plants increase infiltration and attract a variety of birds and butterflies.
